Appointment

Fr Ka Fai has been asked and appointed parochial administrator of St Thomas More, Wollaton in addition to the Parish of St Hugh, Borrowash, from Wednesday 1 October 2014. Sunday Mass remains at 9.30am, but there will be some changes during the weekday and others.

First Holy Communion 2015

There will be a meeting with the Parents and children who intend to make their First Holy Communion in May 2015. The meeting will take place on Thursday 2 October at 7pm in the Parish Meeting Room. The children need to be in Year 3 or above in primary school, and parishioners or regular worshippers here at St Hugh's Parish.

African Catholic Community:

The African community will be celebrating their first Sunday of the month Mass on Sunday 7th September 2014 at 2pm at St George's Church, 40 Village Street, Derby. All Africans and non African are very welcome.

Baptism Preparation: Starting this September, parents wanting Baptism for their child will first need to complete a short programme of preparation. At the request of Deanery clergy, the Deanery Pastoral Council will be running 6 separate preparation programmes between October this year and June next year. Each programme will consist of two evening sessions. The first will be shared with our neighbouring parishes while the second will be in our parish. Our first programme will start on 22nd October. There will be two further programmes in February and May/March and June. Parents with a child for Baptism should contact Fr Ka Fai in the usual way and he will tell you what happens next.
