This year **Day for Life** focuses on cherishing life and accepting death. It provides an opportunity for people to think about the mysteries of life and death, as well as the Church's teaching on appropriate treatment at the end of life. It also highlights the prayer to St. Joseph for a good death. The theme of this year's Day for Life is most appropriate as there is an Assisted Suicide or so-called Assisted Dying Bill (sponsored by Rob Marris MP) scheduled for debate in the House of Commons on 11

September. This year's Day for Life provides another opportunity to talk about support, not suicide at the end of life.

Assisted Dying Bill – Urgent Appeal to Oppose Doctor Assisted Suicide: Please write to your MP today, asking them to oppose the Assisted Dying Bill. There will be a vote in the House of Commons on 11th September 2015. It is urgent to write to MPs before 21st July as this is the last day before the summer recess. After 21st July, many MPs will be away from the House of Commons until September. This Bill would allow doctors or other health professionals to provide help such as lethal drugs for dying people to commit suicide. If passed, this Bill would place vulnerable people at serious risk.
